## **Polygamy Wives and Pari-Mutuel Wagering**

It's highly unlikely that we will be rated by the Church as 3-Nephite or even 2-star missionary recruits, but we are more than willing to walk on and *lean on* a higher power to give our best effort to serve wherever we are called.
