Candidates ...

- Develop positions & statements about issues that matter
 - Meet & present to voters within their constituent areas (Districts)
- Become selected in Primary Elections and/or General Elections.

National Delegates ...

- Attend the Party National Convention
- Vote for presidential candidates (according to the March 22 Presidential Poll results)
- Determine the single Democratic and Republican candidates who will be on the November ballot.
 - Vote on National Party matters

PRECINCT OFFICERS ...

- Recruit and Organize volunteers
- Coordinate with Candidate campaigns
 - Activate voters

DELEGATES ...


- Vote on Party matters in committee meetings
